The Child Care Task Force was then formed by the Palo Alto City Council, which recommended that the City take an active and supportive role in the provision of childhood education and care and that a non-profit corporation be established to implement the Task Force's recommendations. That *original vision* and community advocacy is the foundation represented today by PACCC's dedicated and talented educators, caregivers, administration, and board members. Thank you, Palo Alto, for trusting us with our community's most precious asset – the children!


Teacher Appreciation Week

Externalizing empowers the individual to see an issue outside of themselves and address it with confidence, sensitivity, and applied knowledge.
